The revisions will be recommended to the Board for approval and changes will be communicated to students, families, staff, and the community.

All CTC activities and decisions will be informed by the PA DOH, PDE, and our partner districts & agencies. Depending upon the public health conditions in any county within the Commonwealth, there could be additional actions, orders, or guidance provided by the Pennsylvania Department of Education (PDE) and/or the Pennsylvania Department of Health (DOH). The CTC will practice and support prevention and mitigation efforts in response to the changing conditions.

The CTC is prepared to practice prevention and mitigation strategies along a continuum of most to least restrictive strategies in response to the changing conditions of the Pandemic.

2. How will the LEA ensure continuity of services, including but not limited to services to address the students' academic needs, and students' and staff members' social, emotional, mental health, and other needs, which may include student health and food services?

Should circumstances with the pandemic or other emergencies necessitate the closure of the district for in-person instruction, The CTC will offer real-time, live streamed classes for all students in grades 10-12. However, SHCTC will make every effort to ensure in-person instruction, which is critical for career and tech student learning, remains in place.

GEERS II funding will provide contracted mental health services to meet the challenges of students in crisis, and students in need of identified services.

Cleaning and maintaining healthy facilities, including improving ventilation;	The CTC will continue to promote handwashing and other common-sense health measures during the school year. Handwashing and respiratory etiquette signage will be posted in common areas. The CTC made capital improvements during the spring and summer of 2021 which improved ventilation and filtering systems in the school.
e. Contact tracing in combination with isolation and guarantine, in collaboration with the State and local health departments;	Staff members who test positive for COVID-19 will not be permitted to return to work for five days. Day 0 is the first day of symptoms or a positive viral test. Day 1 is the first full day after your symptoms developed or your test was collected. End isolation after 5 full days if you are fever-free for 24 hours (without the use of fever-reducing medication) and your symptoms are improving.
f. <u>Diagnostic</u> and screening testing;	COVID testing are available at the IU9 Smethport office. Inquiries should be directed to the Assistant to the Executive Director.
g. Efforts to provide <u>vaccinations to school</u> <u>communities;</u>	Vaccinations are readily available at health care facilities and drug stores throughout the region.

h. Appropriate accommodations for students with disabilities with respect to health and safety policies; and	The CTC will provide reasonable accommodations, as appropriate, to students with disabilities with respect to health and safety strategies.
